FOR SUBNATIONAL STATISTICS PARLIAMENT AND STATE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY (SLA) 2025

SUBANG AND KINRARA PARLIAMENTARY AND STATE CONSTITUENCIES LEAD IN THE NUMBER OF BUSINESS ENTITIES IN MALAYSIA

PUTRAJAYA, 29th OCTOBER 2025 – The Department of Statistics, Malaysia (DOSM) today released the Subnational Statistics Parliament and State Legislative Assembly (SLA) 2025. This fourth edition of the publication provides enhanced granularity on key statistical indicators for targeted geographical areas, specifically at the parliament and SLA levels.

According to the estimated population in 2024, P.102 Bangi maintained its position as the most populous parliamentary constituency with 723.8 thousand persons, followed by P.111 Kota Raja (550.6 thousand) and P.104 Subang (503.3 thousand). At the SLA level, N.49 Kota Iskandar led with 323.4 thousand persons, followed by N.40 Kota Anggerik (308.1 thousand) and N.37 Bukit Lanjan (303.9 thousand).

In terms of geographical spread, P.216 Hulu Rajang in Sarawak is the largest parliamentary constituency by land area, covering 34,080 square kilometres. It is followed by P.220 Baram (22,075 sq km) and P.187 Kinabatangan (18,068 sq km). Similarly, the state constituencies with the largest land area are located in Sarawak, namely N.64 Baleh (11,607 sq km), N.65 Belaga (11,579 sq km), and N.57 Kuamut (10,954 sq km).

The Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, stated, "This year's publication also includes data on voters from the Election Commission and the number of eligible citizens, enabling more accurate and equitable planning of electoral boundaries, voting logistics, and demographic analysis. For example, citizens from Sabah and Sarawak are forced to forgo their voting rights in their home states due to the high cost of transportation, resulting in lower voter turnout. In contrast, citizens from Kelantan and Terengganu, most of whom reside in the Klang Valley, tend to return to their home states to vote during elections, leading to a higher number of voters."

On population density, P.116 Wangsa Maju recorded the highest density with 14,056 persons per square kilometre, followed by P.100 Pandan (11,969 persons/sq km) and P.050 Jelutong (11,765 persons/sq km). At the state level, the highest densities were found in N.27 Pengkalan Kota (21,811 persons/sq km), N.21 Pandan Indah (15,365 persons/sq km), and N.30 Sungai Pinang (14,344 persons/sq km).

Analysing the demographic composition, a predominant concentration of the Bumiputera ethnic group was observed in P.034 Setiu, P.030 Jeli and P.038 Hulu Terengganu, each exceeding 99.4 per cent. Meanwhile, the highest percentage of the Chinese ethnic group was recorded in P.114 Kepong (72.4%), P.049 Tanjong (71.2%), and P.048 Bukit Bendera (69.2%). The parliament of P.065 Ipoh Barat recorded the highest percentage of the Indian ethnic group at 26.0 per cent while, the highest percentage of others ethnic was recorded in P.007 Padang Terap at 7.1%.

At the state constituency level, the highest concentration of Bumiputera ethnic groups was recorded in N.21 Telemung, N.22 Manir, and N.36 Bukit Bunga, each exceeding 99.6 percent. Meanwhile, the highest percentage of the Chinese ethnic group was recorded in N.31 Batu Lancang (83.9%), N.54 Pelawan (80.9%), and N.27 Pasir Pinji (79.7%). N.30 Buntong registered the highest percentage of the Indian ethnic group at 49.4 percent, while the highest percentage of other ethnicities was recorded in N.08 Pedu at 7.1%.

In the context of economic establishments, parliaments in Selangor continue to lead. P.104 Subang recorded the highest number of establishments with 32,898, followed by P.105 Petaling Jaya (31,910) and P.106 Damansara (29,743). Similarly, for state

constituencies, N.30 Kinrara led with 19,515 establishments, followed by N.32 Seri Setia (19,064) and N.40 Kota Anggerik (15,637).

Regarding infrastructure and basic amenities, the data highlights diversity across constituencies. P.104 Subang had the highest count of pharmacies at 250, while P.105 Petaling Jaya led in the number of private clinics (221). For state constituencies, N.32 Seri Setia recorded the most pharmacies (127) and private clinics (141).

From the aspect of spirituality and sustainability, the data shows the existence of various worship centres encompassing mosques, temples, churches, and pagodas across the country, reflecting Malaysia's diversity of religions and beliefs. For instance, P.189 Semporna recorded 116 mosques, while P.168 Kota Marudu had 373 Churches and P.110 Klang had 229 temples. From an environmental sustainability perspective, the increasing number of recycle centers in several areas such as P.046 Batu Kawan (46 centers), P.158 Tebrau (40 centers), N.17 Bukit Tengah (36 centers) and N.41 Puteri Wangsa (27 centers) indicates encouraging growth in community awareness regarding the importance of protecting the environment through recycling practices.

"These detailed subnational statistics are crucial for evidence-based planning and policy formulation, ensuring that development strategies are tailored to the unique needs and characteristics of each constituency," concluded Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin.

ASEAN-Malaysia 2025 Chairmanship: The Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) will chair the 15th ASEAN Community Statistical System Committee (ACSS15) which aims to strengthen the statistical cooperation towards sustainable regional development.

Malaysia, for the first time, ranked as number one (1) globally in the biennial Open Data Inventory (ODIN) 2024/25 report released by Open Data Watch (ODW), surpassing 197 other countries. This achievement marks a significant leap from its 67th position in the ODIN 2022/23 assessment.

The Government of Malaysia has declared October 20th as National Statistics Day (MyStats Day), with the theme 'Statistics is the Essence of Life'. Meanwhile, the Fourth

World Statistics Day was celebrated on 20th October 2025, with the theme 'Driving Change with Quality Statistics and Data for Everyone'.

Chart 1: Number of registered voters, total votes and voter turnout percentage by parliamentary constituency in Kelantan and Terengganu, 15th General Election (GE15)

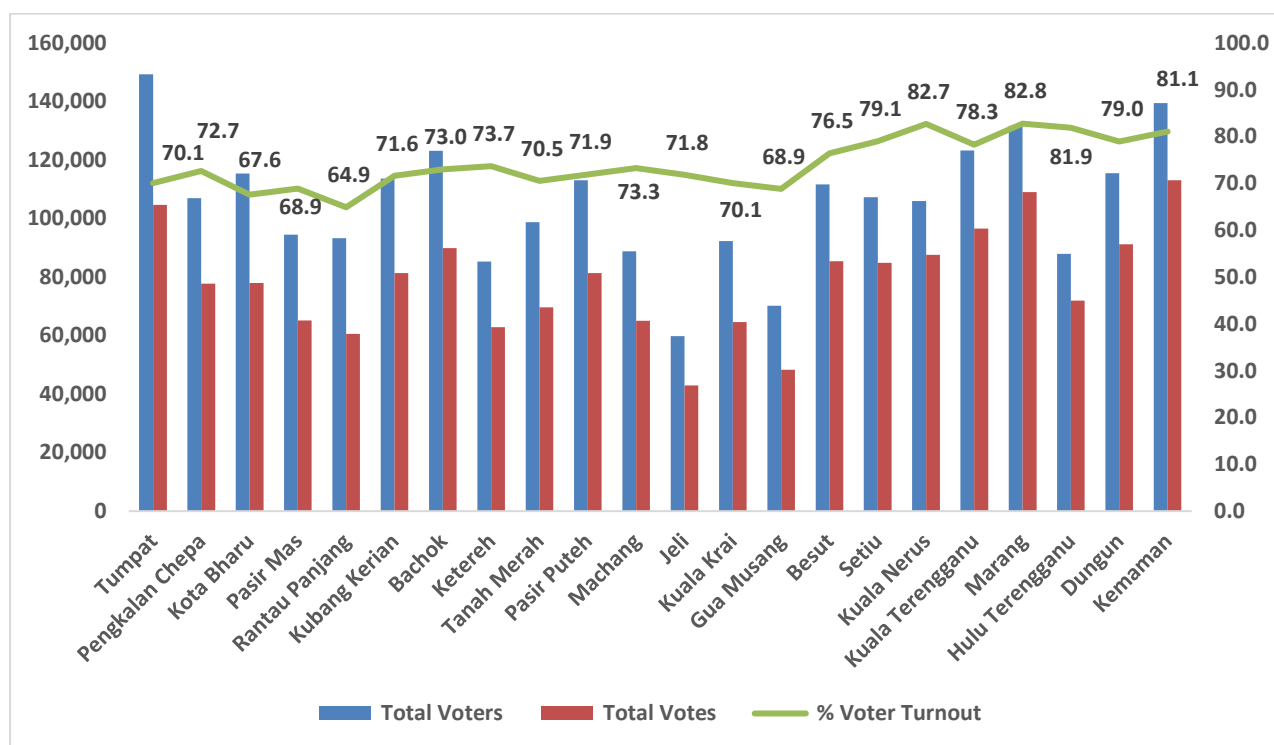


Chart 2: Number of registered voters, total votes and voter turnout percentage by parliamentary constituency in Sabah, 15th General Election (GE15)

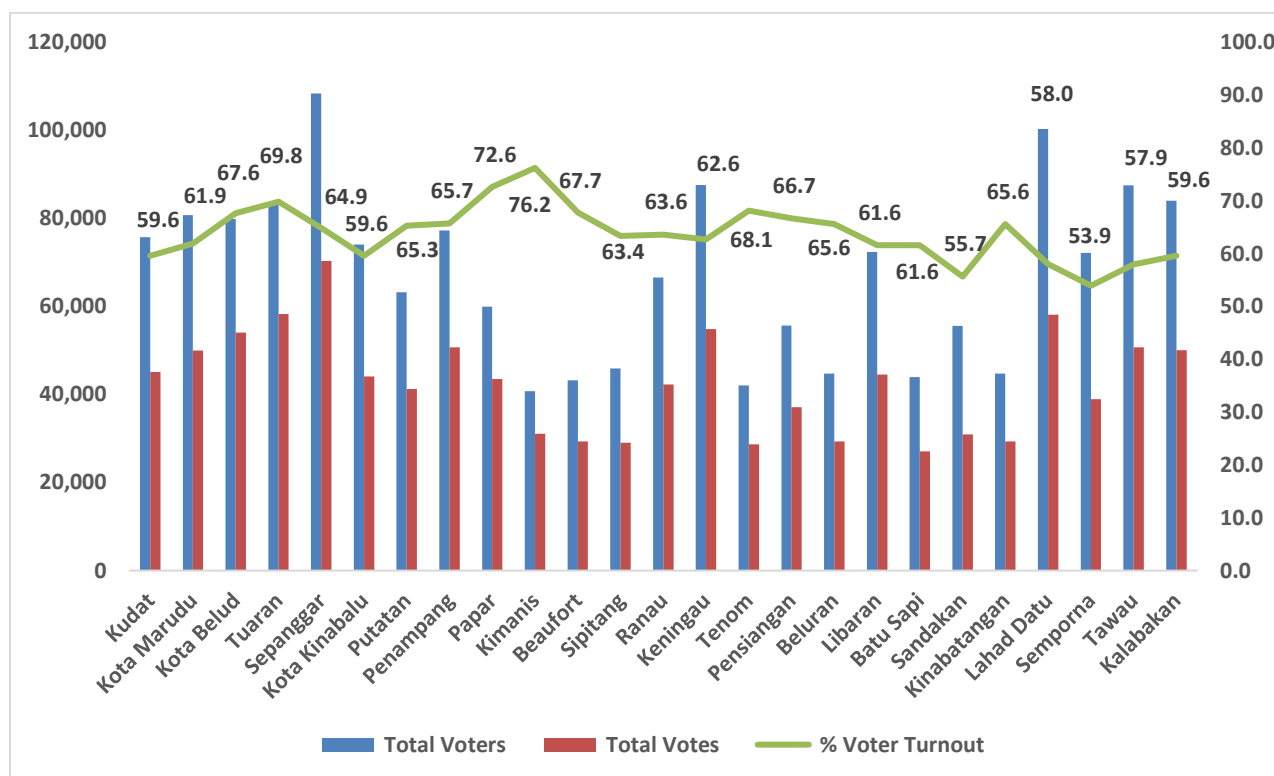


Chart 3: Number of registered voters, total votes and voter turnout percentage by parliamentary constituency in Sarawak, 15th General Election (GE15)

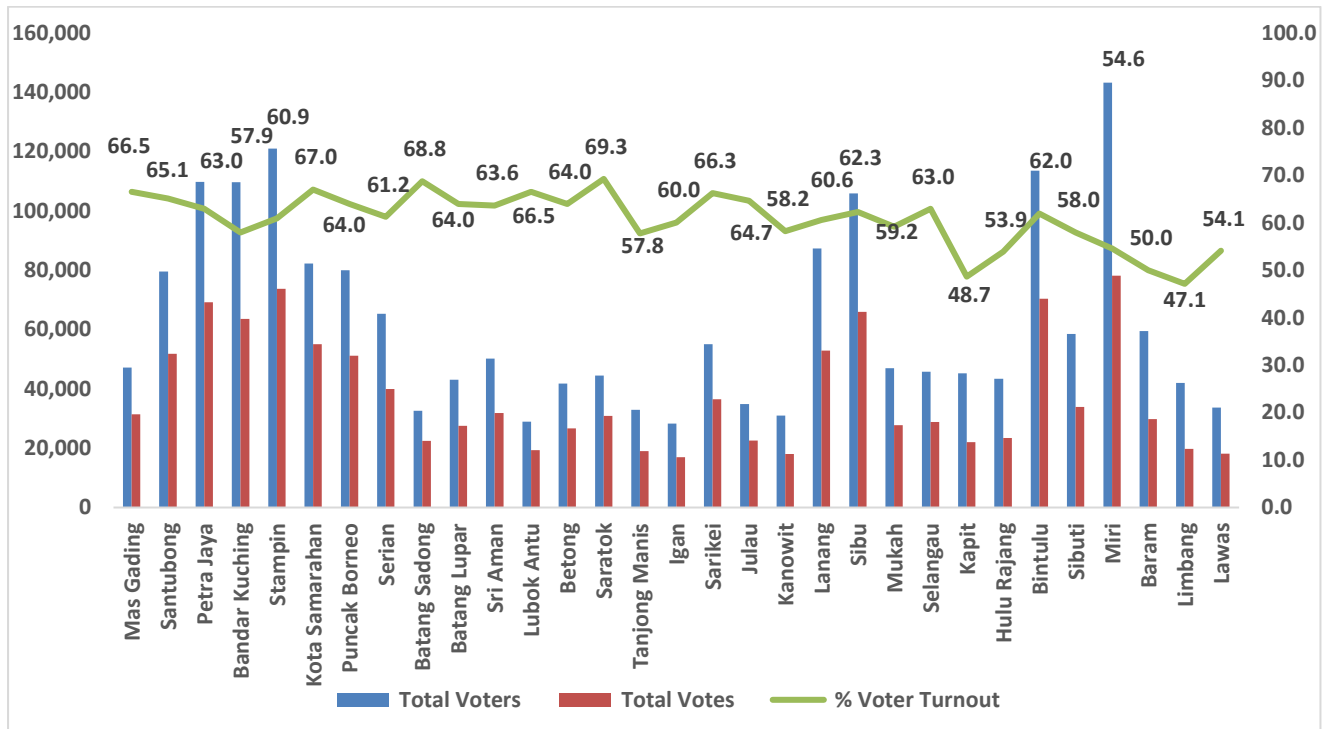


Exhibit 1: Infographic on Subnational Statistics Parliament and State Legislative Assembly 2025

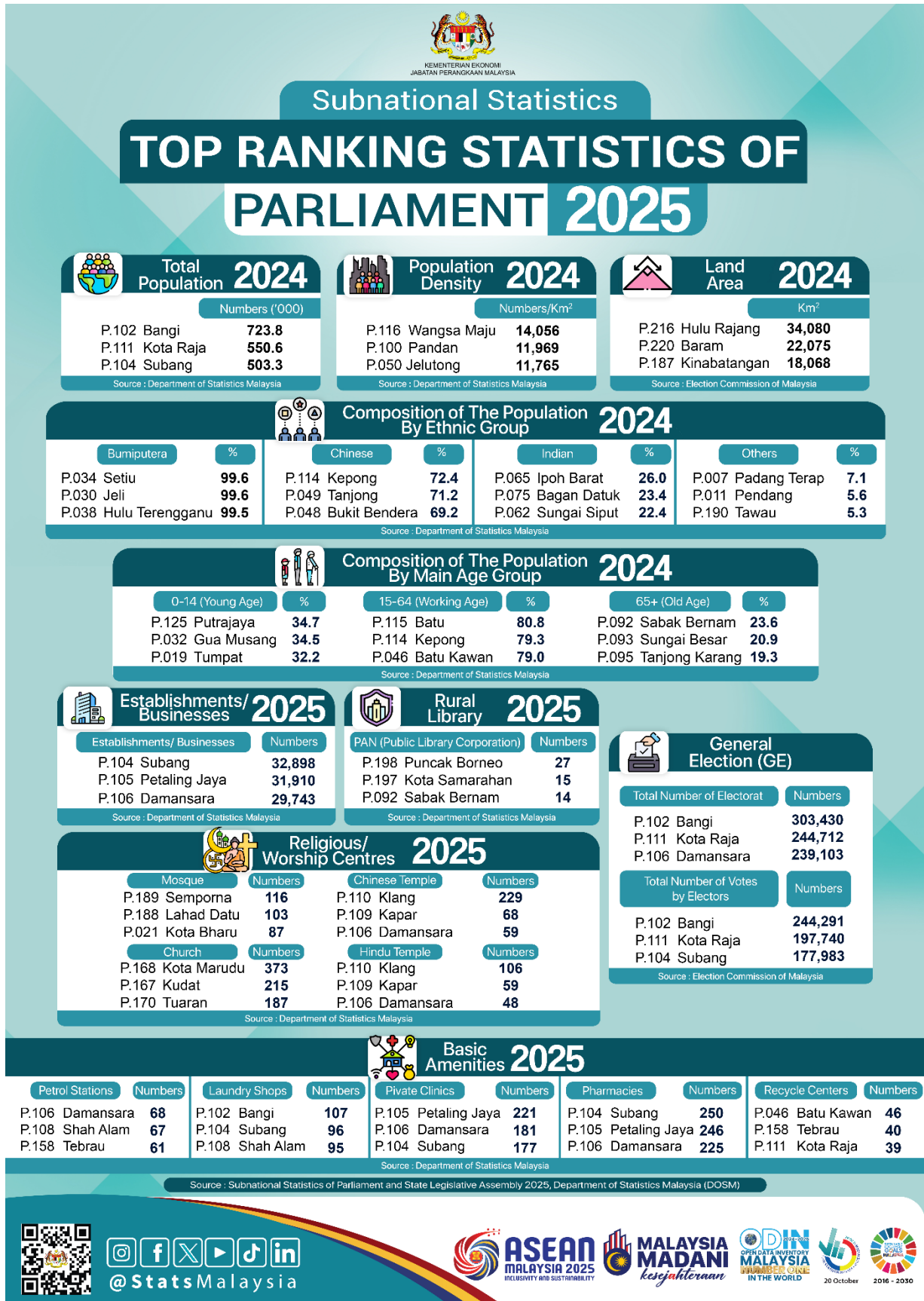


Exhibit 2: Infographic on Subnational Statistics State Legislative Assembly 2025
