CPC, HS & SITC CODE AND CLASSIFICATION

The Central Product Classification (CPC) 2.1 constitutes a complete product classification covering all goods and services. It serves as an international standard for assembling and tabulating all kinds of data requiring product detail, including statistics on industrial production, domestic and foreign commodity trade, international trade in services, balance of payments, consumption and price statistics and other data used within the national accounts. It provides a framework for international comparison and promotes harmonization of various types of statistics related to goods and services. The CPC 2.1 contains 2,887 subclasses (5 digits). Definition

Harmonized System (HS)



Standard Industrial Trade Classification (SITC)

Harmonized System or simply “HS” is a multipurpose international product nomenclature developed by the World Customs Organization (WCO). It allows participating countries to classify traded goods on a common basis for customs purposes to classify commodities when they are being declared at the custom frontiers by exporters and importers. At the international level, the HS Code for classifying goods is a six-digit code system. It was introduced in 1988 and has been adopted by most of the countries worldwide maintained by WCO. It has undergone several changes in the classification of products. These changes are called revisions and entered into force in 1996, 2002, 2007, 2012 and 2017.

SITC is the Standard International Trade Classification which is a statistical classification of the commodities entering external trade. It is designed to provide the commodity aggregates required for purposes of economic analysis and to facilitate the international comparison of trade by commodity data. The latest International Standard of Trade Classification is SITC Revision 4 which is five-digit code endorsed by United Nations Statistic Division (UNSD). DOSM has developed a nine-digit SITC for statistical publication purposes.
