










## Malaysia involvement in the #UN53SC



## Highlights at #UN53SC

**Dr. Uzir** asserted that "The continued involvement will ensure full alignment with global statistical standards in order to expand relevance, timeliness as well as comparable data and statistics that are in line with international good practices, scientific and ethical principles. DOSM as the central agency for official national statistics will continue to be actively involved and supportive in order to improve coverage of many vital statistical indicators as well as to provide reliable official statistics that are relevant to the policy that will benefit the whole National Statistical System and the well-being of society."



Malaysia proposed that, communication regarding data request and verification of estimated data by Custodian Agencies/ UN Agencies with countries should involve National Statistics Offices (NSOs) to ensure the consistency of data reported at global and national platform.

Malaysia called for and encouraged the use of ICT and digitisation to modernise the population and housing census, citing Malaysia's achievements and successes in implementing the Malaysia Population and Housing Census 2020 (MyCensus 2020) at a critical moment when many countries had postponed its implementation.



Malaysia welcomes the adoption of the 50-year Statistical Commissions Terms of Reference (ToR).



Malaysia agrees on the need to harmonise the SEEA Central Framework and updated 2008 SNA. Malaysia supports collaboration between the Committee, the Advisory Expert Group on National Accounts and the Inter-secretariat Working Group on National Accounts.

Malaysia strongly believes that a good practice in data stewardship is fundamental to providing high-quality data that is consistent and easily

In this regards, the national analysis on informal sector has also been expanded by incorporating the Agriculture activities to reflect comprehensive insights of informal sector employment considering the nature of Agriculture activities which largely involved smallholders, unstructured and lack of social protection.



Malaysia suggests that the updated 2008 SNA explains explicitly on the treatment of emerging economy such as gig economy, sharing economy, shadow economy and blue economy in view of the national accounts compilation.

The revision of the International Trade Manuals is timely and important to ensure international trade statistics remain accurate and relevant to the users. DOSM is proud to be part of the task team which involve in that revision.

**RPPA** 

Develop an assessment tool to evaluate the quality of available data and explore the use of Non-Traditional Data Sources to produce official statistics (SDG and Non-SDG). Improve capacity building for data quality stewardship in DOSM for non-traditional data. The use of non-traditional data can provide several advantages to the NSOs in producing various official statistics

**BPE** 

The UN Inter-Agency and Expert Group on the SDG Indicators (IAEG-SDGs) describes its two-year process to develop a replacement indicator for SDG target 17.3 (Mobilize additional financial resources for developing countries from multiple sources). The Group describes specific financing flows to be covered through six sub-indicators: Official sustainable development grants; Official concessional sustainable development loans; Official concessional sustainable development; Mobilized private finance; and Private grants.

**BPPAS** 

ILMIA

While law is an important basis for data sharing but it does not solve everything. NSOs are encouraged to use the self-assessment tool to assess its current law to improve access to administrative data. The establishment of an MoU will further facilitate the access and sharing of data.

**CTBDA** 

The Statistical Performance Indicators will complement the United Nations' National Quality Assurance Frameworks Manual for Official Statistics and National Strategies for the Development of Statistics by PARIS21 which currently have been used to assess countries' statistical capacity. We look forward to implement best practices of SPI to strengthen national's statistical capacity.

CMO

The use of MPI that includes a non-monetary dimension can help identify the poverty level of the people more thoroughly beside the income dimension. Furthermore, MPI can also assist the Government in identifying areas of concern that need attention instead of income. It also ensure that the development programs implemented are more comprehensive and meet the quality of life of the citizens.

**BPHPP** 

GDP may measure economic growth, but at what cost? Should we measure environmental progress as a key performance in the economy? It is about new wealth of nations and measuring economic progress in human terms.

**BPAN** 

UNSD-FCDO project aimed at monitoring the SDGs has helped 20 countries in Asia and Africa measure the achievement of the SDGs effectively through the development of national data, metadata and SDG platform as well as improved coordination, increasing data sharing and awareness of data.

**BPPIB** 

Citizen Generated Data is a possible additional data source to be explored for the purpose of compiling official statistics in Malaysia. This can be done by working closely with civil societies in Malaysia to assess available data's ability in filling the gaps, such as for SDG.

MBLS

Small Area Estimation is a new tools in generating selected SDG indicators at small area level for poverty estimation, food insecurity and undernutrition, health related indicators and unemployment rate. Data from Housing and Population Census 2020, surveys and other admin data can be leverage as auxiliary variables in ensuring the precision of the estimates.

**BPTMS** 

Discussion focused on data use challenges and solutions from the perspective of NSOs along with the efforts taken to improve uptake and impact of their data. It also highlighted the project and framework for data use improvement as well as proposed transformation of data use for official statistics among the statistical community.

BPIP 🕽















The Survey of Employees of NSOs allows the NSOs to measure the employee's attitudes and competencies. It provides key evidence to improve employees management, including through measures tailored to NSO contexts and by benchmarking with other NSOs. Through the results of the survey, management could provide a solution to address the identified weaknesses.

**BKS** 

GIST performed a study on how training is organised at NSOs (funded by UNDESA) and to highlight successes, challenges and needs related to establishing and further developing sustainable in-house training programmes involve 15 countries and 7 regional statistical organisations. To encourage diversity in training, GIST recommended selecting participants using a framework and the need for gender balance and pre-training assessment.
